The Et Al Pan

Pea Pickin' Cake

(also known as Pig Pickin' Cake, Pea Picker Cake)

One bowl. One pan. The most perfect summertime cake you will ever bring to a gathering. This Southern classic has been showing up at cookouts, reunions, and potlucks for decades — and for very good reason.

Mandarin oranges mixed right into the cake batter. Crushed pineapple folded into the cool whip topping. The result is a cake that is light, fruity, impossibly moist, and somehow refreshing in a way that no other dessert quite manages to be.

It's the cake people ask about every single time. And now you're the one who makes it.

Why it works

Mandarin oranges in the batter keep the cake incredibly moist and add a subtle citrus sweetness throughout every bite.

Crushed pineapple in the topping gives the cool whip a tropical lift and a light texture that feels like summer in every forkful.

One bowl means less cleanup and more time enjoying the party you made it for.
